College Profile



Government Degree College Jammu City (Paloura) was established vide Government Order No. 269-HE of 2007 dated 20-12-2007 and it was decided that College would function in a newly constructed block of the Government Higher Secondary School, Paloura having two rooms. With the passage of time, requirements of the College increased and the authorities decided to shift the College from Higher Secondary School, Paloura to Govt. College of Engineering and Technology (GCET), Old University Campus, Canal Road, Jammu and subsequently the same got shifted to the said location on 6th of Oct. 2009. It continued to function in makeshift accommodation at Canal Road, Jammu till March 2018. The main building of the College was constructed and in April, 2018 the College finally shifted to its own campus at Mishriwala. The College is affiliated to University of Jammu and is a co-educational institution; recognized by UGC under section 2 (b) and 12 (f) of UGC act 1956. The College has successfully implemented NEP 2020, from 2022- 2023 session as per the guidelines of University of Jammu. The College offers courses in Arts and Humanities; Social Sciences and Science Stream.

Since, GDC Paloura aims for a holistic all-round development of its students so they are encouraged to participate in curricular and co-curricular activities. The College is proud of its qualified, competent and dedicated staff. Apart from teaching and academic work, the teaching faculty of the College organizes and takes part in national, international seminars, workshops and conferences. To keep themselves upgraded the faculty of the College also attends refresher, orientation and faculty development programs. The main building of the College comprises of 8 lecture halls, 5 laboratories, 1 first-aid-center and a well equipped library having books of different subjects. The College has taken digital initiatives by providing interactive panels in five class rooms and has also established one browsing center.

The College is having a new block having 8 lecture halls and 4 laboratories, new toilet block and a girl's hostel that can accommodate 270 girls. The College is running quite successfully in Curricular and Co-curricular activities in general and academics in particular.

College Discipline

No outsider is allowed to enter the college without proper permission. Students have to be in proper uniform during the whole academic session. The Uniform of the college for girls is white Kameez (Below the knees), white Salwar and white Dupatta (plain) and Black Sweater in winter and for Boys is Plain White Shirt, Plain Black Pant and Black Sweater in Winters. However, Pink Salwar, kameez and dupatta is allowed to married female students and pink dupatta to engaged female students.

If a student remains absent from the college without prior permission of the Principal for more than ten consecutive days, his/her name shall be struck off from the college rolls. Unlawful assembly of students in the college is prohibited. Writing on the walls or pasting posters is a grave offence.

Rules of Discipline

- Students are responsible for their conduct to the Principal and are prohibited from doing anything either inside or outside the college that will amount to a breach of discipline or interference in the discipline and normal working of the college. A student shall be liable to disciplinary action for violation of any of the rules of discipline. Disciplinary action may involve warning and/or suspension from classes, from the examination, from use of the College Library or even from the College.
- Students shall conduct themselves in a polite manner, both towards the members of the staff (teaching and administrative) and towards their fellow students. In subordination, unbecoming language or ungentlemanly conduct including teasing etc., shall be severely dealt with.

Ragging in any form, on or off the college Campus, including the hostel, is a serious offence and the students involved in ragging shall be severely punished (As per Supreme Court Ruling).

It has been impressed upon by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India that if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him/her from the Institution.

Mobile Phones are strictly prohibited in the college campus for the students. Stern action will be taken against the students resorting to unfair means in the examination.

A student desirous of withdrawing his/her name from the college rolls should submit an application countersigned by the parents/guardian of the student. The withdrawal certificate shall be issued only after the student clear all the college dues. Such students shall not be re-admitted during the same academic session.

Any student, who indulges in any indiscipline in the college, shall not be eligible for any prize, certificate, college honour, award for scholarship from the institution. This shall apply to all the students including NCC cadets, NSS volunteers and players as well.

Identity Card

Every student, on being admitted shall be issued an identity card which he/She has to carry all the time and shall produce on demand by any member of the college staff anywhere in the college premises. Loss of the identity card should be reported immediately to the College authorities.

A new identity card is not ordinarily issued. However, after proper verification, a duplicate I-card can be issued against a payment of Rs. 100/-.

Identity card must be returned at the end of each session failing which an amount of Rs. 100/- shall be charged.

Co-curricular & Extra Mural Activities

In order to strengthen and support the institutional activities in the college, various cells have been constituted. As per interest of the students, new projects are planned and implemented by the college administration through these cells.

NCC

NCC, which stands for National Cadet Corps, was formed in India in 1948 as a voluntary organisation which recruits cadets from high schools, colleges and universities all over India. The cadets are given basic military training in small arms and parades. In living up to its motto, 'Unity and Discipline', NCC strives to be and is one of the most significant cohesive forces of the nation, bringing together the youth hailing from different parts of the country and molding them into responsible and courageous citizens of the nation. The college has both NCC Boys and Girls wings with the enrollment of 50 students in both wings respectively. Enrolment of students to NCC is done at the time of admission. All the students who are physically fit are ordinarily enrolled as cadets. Regular parades (twice a week) are held under the supervision of the P.T. Staff of the Army and NCC officer. Complete uniform is issued to each NCC cadet. They have to be in their uniform in all the parade sessions. Selected NCC cadets participate in local RD parade. The cadets are trained in handling fire arms. The NCC cadets can qualify for 'B' and 'C' certificates after completing the required eligibility conditions and successfully passing the tests held by the NCC Directorate. NCC organization helps students to prepare themselves for the service of the nation in peace and war times.

NSS

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is a Central Sector Scheme of Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports. NSS was formally launched on 24th September, 1969, the birth centenary year of the Father of the Nation. Therefore, 24 September is celebrated every year as NSS Day with appropriate programmes and activities.

It provides opportunity to the student youth of 11th & 12th Class of schools at +2 Board level and student youth of Technical Institution, Graduate & Post Graduate at colleges and University level of India to take part in various government led community service activities & programmes. The sole aim of the NSS is to provide hands on experience to young students in delivering community service. NSS of this College takes pride in its vast pool of immensely zealous volunteers who show a profound amount of initiative and eagerness in undertaking all kinds of social services, as well as identify and resonate with the cause and aim of NSS. Every Year college organizes Annual Camps to infuse among the volunteers, the spirit of selfless service and dedication to the cause of social reconstruction.

Women Development Cell

Women's Development Cell (WDC) of the college plays an active role in making the students aware of the problems faced by women and suggest ways and methods for their development in society. GDC Paloura sensitizes the college community on issues pertaining to women's rights, gender parity and empowerment. It attempts to sensitize and raise awareness of gender discrimination, women's rights, and empowerment concerns among the student and teaching communities. This cell deals with the problems exclusively faced by the female students. Experts from the Medical Department, Social Welfare Department and Women organizations are invited to deliver lectures on any issue of importance and problems faced by women students in the society.

Career Counseling Guidance & Placement Cell

The placement Cell is an integral part of the college which functions to ensure the best placements for the students graduating from this College. To remain competitive in today's world, being adept in one area will not suffice. One has to be familiar with other domains too. Spearheaded by able professionals with guidance from the Principal and Faculty members, Placement Cell works round the year and closely coordinates with recruiting teams from leading corporate houses to make sure that every student gets suitable openings once they finish their courses. Placement Cell has a perfect understanding of how the corporate world works and this helps in organizing events and programs that provide avenues for the students to get exposed to the real world of work.

Eco Club

Eco club is a platform on which we got the knowledge about environment. The meaning of an eco-club is a group who works to contribute to improving environmental conditions. They offer programs and activities to encourage others to reduce pollution, plant trees, and more. Eco club is a voluntary group of GDC Paloura students which promotes students in learning and improving their environment. An Eco- club is a means by which students and youth can organize themselves to learn more and this issue, and also take action to improve their immediate environment. Eco club will take up activities and programmes through Seminars, Paintings, Debates, Symposia, Cleanliness Drives etc. The main objective of Eco Club is to mobilize the students to undertake activities that help saving the environment for present and future generations of mankind. These Club co-ordinates with Government programmes under Mission LIFE

Road Safety Club

In order to create awareness among college students on road safety and to educate road users about the traffic rules, regulations and other road safety measures, a Road Safety Club is formulated in the college with a vision 'to reduce accidents and save lives'. Time to time various activities are being conducted in the form of :- Seminar, Traffic awareness rally, Poster, Quiz & Slogan Competitions, lectures from Traffic and Motor Vehicles Departments etc. to develop skills among the students for taking appropriate action in various traffic situations & assist Govt. in implementing Road Safety Programmes.

Anti Ragging Cell



Ragging is punishable offence

"Ragging" means the doing of any act which causes or is likely to cause any physical, psychological or physiological harm or apprehension or shame or embarrassment to a student and includes-

- (a) Teasing or abusing or playing practical joke on, or causing hurt to any student. Or
- (b) Asking any student to do any act, or perform anything, which he/she would not, in the ordinary course, be willing to do or perform.

Prohibition of Ragging:

- (a) Ragging within an educational institutions is strictly prohibited.
- (b) No person shall participate in, abet or propagate, ragging in any educational institution.

Penalty for Ragging:

- (a) Expulsion from the educational institution, if found guilty on enquiry by the college against a complaint lodged by any other student.
- (b) Imprisonment of either description upto two years or fine up to five thousand rupees or both.
- (c) Any student convicted shall be dismissed from college and shall not be re-admitted. Students in distress owing to ragging should approach the college Anti-Ragging committee or Principal.

SCIENCE CLUB

The main purpose of the club is to inculcate scientific attitude among the students by organising various scientific activities like Seminars, Symposia, debates, quiz contests, etc.

RED RIBBON CLUB

The Red Ribbon Club is established with the aim for generating awareness among the students regarding HIV AIDS. The Club organises activities like Seminars, Symposia, Debates, Rallies, Skits, Poster Making Competitions, etc., on the various aspects of HIV AIDS.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

To make the system transparent, accountable and accessible to all, the grievance Cell has been constituted in the college. Complaints of the Students/ Teachers/Administrative Staff/Parents are received through a Complaint Box placed near the main notice board of the college. The box is opened by the Convener and Members of the cell once a week. All the complaints received get due

redressal by the Principal/HOD of the concerned department, Librarian/Administrative Staff. Appropriate action is taken under rules to resolve the problems brought in the notice of the authorities by the aggrieved students/persons

INSTITUTION'S INNOVATION COUNCIL

The Ministry of Education (MoE) through MoE's Innovation Cell (MIC) launched the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) program in collaboration with AICTE for Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) to systematically foster the culture of innovation and start-up ecosystem in education institutions. The primary mandate of MIC is to encourage, inspire and nurture young students by supporting them to work with new ideas and transform them into prototypes. Primarily, IICs' role is to engage large number of faculty, students and staff in various innovation and entrepreneurship related activities such as ideation, Problem solving, Proof of Concept development, Design Thinking, IPR, project handling and management at Pre-incubation/Incubation stage, etc., so that innovation and entrepreneurship ecosystem gets established and stabilized in HEIs.

COLLEGE NEWSLETTER (PRATIBIMB)

The college administration released newsletter in the session 2023-24. It encompassed all the activities organized by the college.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION & SPORTS

The college has splendid play ground with sufficient facilities to organize sports activities. Sports Development Committee of the College encourages students to take part in games. Our students have represented the college at the State and National level and have brought laurels to this institution. The students are selected for field activity once the admission process is completed. They are encouraged to take part in games of their own interest.

TOURS & PICNICS

Educational and Subject tours, are organized from time to time by the college. Students are taken on subject tours arranged by the concerned departments. Picnics in an academic year are held. Venues are decided by the mutual consent of the teachers and student's executive body jointly.

DEPARTMENT OF STUDENT WELFARE

Department of Student's Welfare acts as kind of liaison between the students and the College management. The Dean and Associate Dean of this department work for the welfare of the student community by organizing various activities that enrich their academic, literary, cultural and social life. This department in the beginning of each session, forms a Students Executive Body by electing representatives which works for the development of the institution in coordination with the Dean Student's Welfare.

STUDENT EXECUTIVE BODY

The college management through Department of Student's Welfare elects class representative from every section through an election process. Students' Executive Body is formed out of the students' selected as class representatives, which assist the college management in its functioning. It participate in policy making for students welfare. This body also helps in maintaining college discipline and guides the students to follow campus rules and regulations.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

The college library provides library facilities to its bonafide students. The college library is well furnished, and has a spacious reading room which promises a cool, calm and serene atmosphere for reading. A special text book section has been created in the library to help the poor and deserving students to borrow test books, whenever required. Students can borrow only two books at a time and retain with them for a maximum period of 15 days.

LIBRARY RULES

Students can borrow books from the college library only on the production of their Identity cards. The borrowers shall be charged for cost of the book or they will have to replace them with a new copy in case the book is found damaged or lost. A fine of Rs. 1/- for each day shall be charged on each book in case the borrower fails to return the book/books on the due date. If a student loses her identity card, he/she must report its loss to the Chief Librarian at once and apply for a duplicate identity card after paying the requisite fee. Reference books cannot be issued to the students. These can, however be consulted by the students in the library. Students are not allowed to carry their personal books or belongings inside the college library.

COLLEGE BUS

The college has a bus for providing transport facility to our dear students. The College Bus Service is more secure for students to reach college well in time in the hazardous atmosphere of local traffic. The nominal fee shall be charged for availing the Bus facility.

Criteria for Admission (2026-27)

As per the Higher Education Department, Government of Jammu & Kashmir, the following eligibility conditions apply for candidates seeking admission to Four-Year Undergraduate Programs (FYUGP).

Who Can Apply?

Candidates must have successfully passed the 10+2 (Higher Secondary Part-II) examination or equivalent from:

1. Jammu & Kashmir Board of School Education (JKBOSE)
2. Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE)
3. Or any other recognized board.

Admission Basis:

· Merit-based admission shall be conducted using the marks obtained in the Class 12th (10+2) examination.

· Seat allotment will be done based on:

- 10+2 merit
- Availability of seats
- Preferences filled by the candidate during the online admission process.

· Applicants must complete online registration through the JK Admission Portal- <https://jkadmissions.in>

IMPLEMENTATION

NEP2020 is being gradually implemented across educational institutions in India, including University of Jammu. All the proposed changes may take time to fully integrate, but the policy aims to create a more inclusive, flexible, and relevant education system.

The undergraduate programme shall extend over four academic years (eight semesters). The students can exit with a:

1. Certificate after the completion of one academic year (two semesters);
2. Diploma after the study of two academic years (four semesters) and
3. Bachelor degree after the completion of three academic years (six semesters).
4. A candidate who successfully completes a three-year bachelor's degree with minimum CGPA of 7.5 and wishes to pursue the fourth year of the undergraduate programme shall be allowed to continue the programme to obtain the bachelor's degree with honours/research.

CREDIT PLAN OF THE FOUR YEARS UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME UNDER NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY (NEP 2020)

1. Major Course

Each student will study for

- a) 62 Credits in Major for Three Years Graduation
- b) 94 Credits in Major for Four Years Graduation (Honours)
- c) 82 Credits in Major for Four Years Graduation (Honours with Research)

Major Course can be any subject chosen from the following six disciplines

- I. Science
- II. Arts and Humanities
- III. Social and Behavioural Sciences

2. Minor Course

Each student will study

- a) 24 credits of minor course for three year graduation from 1st to 6th semester (4 credits in each semester). 50% Credits of Minor courses shall be 200 or above level in the relevant subject/discipline and another 50% of the total credits of minor can be earned from any other discipline as per students' choice. 32 credits of minor course for four year graduation (honours) / (honours with research) (4 credits in each semester). 50% Credits of Minor courses shall be 200 or above level in the relevant subject/discipline and another 50% of the total credits of minor can be earned from any other discipline as per students' choice.

3. Multidisciplinary Courses from other disciplines (Foundation Courses)

09 Credits of multidisciplinary courses of 03 credits each from 1st to 3rd semester from disciplines other than major with the condition that the subject opted for shall not be repeated in any semester. Students are not allowed to take the same courses studied in the 12th class under the multidisciplinary category.

4. Ability Enhancement Courses

Modern Indian Languages (MIL)-Hindi/Dogri/Urdu/, English language (General). 09 Credits of AEC Courses of 03 Credits each from 1st to 3 Semester.

5. Skill Enhancement Courses

09 Credits of Skill Enhancement Courses (SE) of 03 Credits each from 1st to 3rd Semester. The courses shall be chosen from the basket of courses from NSQF as notified by the University of Jammu. The University departments/ respective Board of Studies can propose new courses in addition to NSQF.

6. Value Added Courses (VA)

The student will have to undertake minimum 08 credits out of below mentioned courses. However, the Value Added Courses at (b) and (c) are compulsory except for students with Environment Science as Major/Minor course. Such students opting for Major/Minor as Environmental Science will undertake (a), (d) (e) and (f):

Admission to Four years undergraduate programmes (FYUGP) shall be on the basis of merit and availability of seats in a particular "Major Subject "

Scheme of Examination :

a) Each course shall be comprised of mid semester assessment test and end-semester examination. The responsibility of conduct and evaluation of the mid semester assessment test lies with the course coordinator. The end semester examination shall be conducted by the University and question papers shall got set by the Controller of Examinations except skill and value added courses. The mid semester assessment marks awarded to the students in each course shall be displayed on the notice board well in advance, at least one week before the commencement of end semester examination. The 03/04 and 02 credits paper shall have 04 and 03 units, respectively. The evaluation of the skill and value added courses will be internal.

Practicals/Tutorials as applicable in a course (major/minor) are extension of the theory programme in an inbuilt (3+1) credit course i.e. 03 credits of theory and 01 credit of practical/tutorial except Indian Music subject. The Indian Music subject shall be of (2+2) credits i.e. 02 credits for theory and 02 credits for practical. Each four credit paper will have 75 marks for theory and 25 marks for practical/tutorial. The break-up for 75 marks for theory paper shall contain 15 marks for mid semester assessment test and 60 marks for end semester examination. There will be continuous assessment of 10 marks and final examination of 15 marks for practical/tutorial component in each course to be conducted by the course coordinator internally. The concerned college will submit awards of 15 marks for mid semester assessment test and 25 marks for practical/tutorial to the office of Controller of Examination. However, college will maintain the record of 25 marks for practical/tutorial as continuous assessment of 10 marks and final examination of 15 marks for separately.

The 03 credits paper (excluding skill course) the concerned college will submit awards of 15 marks for mid semester assessment test to the office of Controller of Examination.

The 03 credits paper shall be of 75 marks consisting of 60 marks for external examination and 15 marks for mid semester assessment test. All 02 credits courses (excluding optional value added courses) shall be of 50 marks comprising 40 marks for end semester examination and 10 marks for mid semester assessment test.

MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY FOR APPEARANCE IN EXAMINATION

Semester End External Examination under four years under graduate programmes (FYUGP) as per NEP 2020 shall be open to the following categories of students:

(A) A regular student i.e. a student who has undergone a regular course of study in a college / offsite campus for the period specified for that course of study by having been on the rolls of the college / offsite campus immediately preceding the examination and has his/her name submitted to the Controller of Examinations by the concerned college / offsite campus where he/she has pursued the course for the examination and admit card shall be issued by the Principal of the College / Rector/Director of offsite campus concerned subject to following conditions:

- (i) He/she has been a student of good conduct.
- (ii) He/she has attended not less than 75% of the lectures delivered including seminars, tutorials, practicals etc. in each course opted by him/her in that semester.
- (iii) He/she has secured pass marks in internal assessment.
- (iv) He/she has paid the prescribed fee.

(B) Students who after having undergone a regular course of study and having completed all conditions of eligibility for appearance in a course(s) in a semester examination including minimum attendance requirement and having passed in internal assessment and having either failed to pass the semester examination in that subject/paper(s) or been unable to appear in the examination in that subject/paper(s) will be eligible to appear as a private candidate in the examination by submitting his/her application on the prescribed form in online/offline mode along with prescribed fee to reach the Controller of Examinations within the dates fixed for the purpose
